Pack your emergency kit and keep it in an accessible place. Each member of your household (and pets) should have a kit



Make an emergency plan with everyone in your household



Practice your plan and check your emergency kit at least twice a year

HAZARDS MAY BE DIFFERENT BASED ON WHERE YOU LIVE, WORK, OR GO TO SCHOOL.

CHECK YOURS IN 3 EASY STEPS:



Step 1: On any device with internet access visit myhazards.caloes.ca.gov or scan the QR Code above.



Step 2: Type your home, work, or school address. It is a good idea to check the hazards for all areas you routinely spend time in.



Step 3: Learn about and prepare for the hazards in your area.

LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

The Local Hazard Mitigation Plan (LHMP) is a 5-year plan that sets the mitigation priorities for the Fire District.

The County is working with cities, special districts, and county departments to identify priority hazards in their jurisdictions. The planning process includes:



• Developing mitigation strategies for each hazard identified in a jurisdiction.



• Asking the public for feedback on our plan. Now that we have a draft, **we want to hear your comments!**

LOCAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

As part of the Hazard Mitigation planning process, 21 natural and human caused hazards were identified as affecting Contra Costa County as a whole.

But hazards differ based on where you live.

Here are the top 3 identified hazards affecting Rodeo and Hercules:



WILDFIRES

Wildfires are unplanned fires that occur in wildlands. In our county, there is a high risk within the urban/wildland interface.



EARTHQUAKES

Scientists estimate that there is a 72% probability of a magnitude 6.7 or greater earthquake in the Bay Area in the near future.



URBAN FLOOD

These floods can happen within minutes or hours of heavy rainfall, a dam or levee failure, or city drains overflowing.
